Father's Day

Contrary to popular belief, Father's Day wasn't created by greeting card companies. It began with one woman's determination to honor fathers.

Some trace its origins to the 1907 Monongah mining disaster in West Virginia, where 361 men, including 250 fathers, died. Grace Golden Clayton, whose father was among the victims, proposed a commemoration, but it didn't become an annual event.

In May 1909, Sonora Louise Smart Dodd of Spokane, Washington, inspired by a Mother's Day sermon, decided to honor fathers, especially her own, William Jackson Smart, a Civil War veteran who raised six children alone. She pitched the idea to the Spokane Ministerial Association and the YMCA, and on June 19, 1910, Spokane held its first Father's Day celebration.

President Woodrow Wilson supported the idea in 1916 but couldn't convince Congress to make it a national holiday. Dodd continued to promote Father's Day, facing criticism and resistance. In 1924, President Calvin Coolidge endorsed it, but without an official proclamation. By the 1930s, efforts to merge Mother's and Father's Days into a single "Parent's Day" arose, but were unsuccessful.

Despite a push from the "Father's Day Council," the holiday remained unofficial. Maine Senator Margaret Chase Smith criticized Congress for recognizing only mothers, not fathers. Finally, in 1966, President Lyndon Johnson declared the third Sunday in June as Father's Day, and in 1972, President Richard Nixon made it a federal holiday.

When celebrating Father's Day, remember Sonora Smart Dodd, who tirelessly worked to honor fathers. She passed away in 1978, aged 96, and is buried in Spokane with a headstone reading: "Sonora Smart Dodd, Founder of Father's Day, 1882-1978."
